INSTRUCTIONS FOR MAIL IN BALLOT

1. **Eligibility to vote by mail:** You must be: (i) eighteen or older, (ii) a U.S. citizen, (iii) have been a resident of Scarsdale for at least 30 days before Election Day, Wednesday November 15, 2017, and (iv) not voting in person at the polls on Election Day. You do not need to be a registered voter.

2. The ballot contains 1 page: On the first page, please vote for candidates to the 2017 CNC in your elementary school district. Voting for more than the number of open seats in your election district, or candidates in other districts, or candidates in multiple districts will invalidate your vote.

3. **After you have voted on the ballot, please take the following steps:**
 1. DO NOT SIGN THE COMPLETED BALLOT.
 2. Place your completed ballot in an unsigned / unmarked envelope and seal it.
 3. Write your return address on another envelope, legibly displaying your name and address.
 4. Address the envelope to: **Scarsdale Procedure Committee, P.O. Box 284, Scarsdale, NY 10583**
 5. Put the unmarked envelope with the ballot in the addressed envelope.
 6. Seal the addressed envelope and sign the seal.
 7. Mail the ballot so that it is received at our PO Box no later than 5 pm on the day of the election - November 15, 2017.

4. By signing the seal of the envelope you will be certifying that: (i) you are eligible to vote (see criteria at the top of this page), (ii) you have not already voted in the election by mail-in ballot and (iii) you will not vote in the election except by this mail-in ballot.

5. If two or more people are voting from the same address, they should mail their ballots in separate envelopes. Multiple ballots in a single envelope will be invalidated.

6. Mail in ballots will be validated against the list of people who voted when the polls close. If you vote in person, the mail in ballot will be discarded.
