

PROCEDURE COMMITTEE INVITES CANDIDATES TO RUN FOR SEATS ON THE 2021-2022 CITIZENS NOMINATING COMMITTEE

Invitation to Run for the CNC: The Procedure Committee invites Scarsdale residents to run for the Citizens Nominating Committee (CNC). As one of 30 members of the CNC, you will interview, evaluate and select candidates who will be on the nonpartisan slate for Village elected offices in the **March 15, 2022 Village-wide trustee election**. This unique system gives our community's elected neighborhood CNC representatives an opportunity to participate in civic affairs and to have their voices heard on who will govern at Village Hall. The Procedure Committee is the group of Scarsdale volunteers who administer the annual election of 10 new members of the CNC.

CNC Election Process: With a simple application process, residents may seek a place on the ballot in the **November 9, 2020 CNC election**. Residents representing each of the five elementary school districts (Edgewood, Fox Meadow, Greenacres, Heathcote and Quaker Ridge, called "Nonpartisan Election Units") will be running for at least two available positions on the CNC by submitting a short Biographical Information form and a Nominating Petition signed by 10 eligible residents from the candidate's Election Unit. **Petitions may be signed individually and submitted electronically**. The forms and filing instructions for both are attached to this page with a FAQ sheet, and may also be downloaded from the Procedure Committee website where the **Non-Partisan Resolution*** governing the system is posted, at www.scarsdaleprocedurecommittee.org.

CNC Activity: The CNC meets 5 or 6 times on weekday evenings at Village Hall beginning at the end of November. **CNC meeting dates for 2020-2021 are: Monday, November 29, 2021 (Organization Meeting); Wednesday, December 8, 2021; Wednesday, December 15, 2021; Wednesday, January 5, 2022; Wednesday, January 12, 2022; and if necessary, Wednesday, January 19, 2022.** By its last meeting date the CNC will nominate a nonpartisan slate of candidates for the open positions on the Scarsdale Board of Trustees.

CNC Eligibility and Term: A candidate for membership on the CNC must be a qualified voter (U.S. citizen and 18 years of age or older), and a resident of Scarsdale for at least two years. A CNC member may not simultaneously be a member of the Procedure Committee, the School Board Nominating Committee, the School Board Administrative Committee, the Scarsdale School Board, the Village Board of Trustees, or the Judicial Qualifications Advisory Council, nor serve simultaneously with a member of the same household. See the **Non-Partisan Resolution** for additional details. Each of the three groups of 10 CNC members serve staggered three-year terms followed by one year on the Procedure Committee.

Deadlines: Submission of both CNC application forms beginning this summer is encouraged. **The filing deadline for both forms is Thursday, September 30.** After this date, additional CNC candidates will be accepted without a petition only if there are fewer than two candidates for each open position in that elementary school district. The CNC election will be held by mail-in ballot or, if in-person voting is feasible, at Village Hall on **Tuesday November 9, 2021 from 7 AM to 9 PM.** Voting by mail-in ballot is always an option.

Note: Under New York State Law, qualified residents may run for village office against the CNC slate by obtaining the prescribed number of signatures on a nominating petition or by running a write-in campaign.

SCARSDALE'S NON-PARTISAN ELECTION SYSTEM EXPLAINED

How can I participate in the village nonpartisan election system? Scarsdale volunteers have many ways to participate meaningfully in civic life through village appointed boards and councils, non-profits and other volunteer organizations. One of the most impactful of these is Scarsdale's nonpartisan election system, which provides a unique vehicle for civic involvement of voters through membership on the Citizens Nominating Committee (CNC).

What is the CNC? The CNC is a group of 30 residents elected by the voters of their neighborhoods in village-wide elections that are held the second Tuesday of November each year. Members of the CNC research, deliberate and, through a process of extensive, thoughtful due diligence, select a slate of nominees for open positions in the offices of Mayor, Village Trustee and Village Justice. Once the CNC has chosen its slate of candidates, they are placed on the ballot in a village election held the third week of March every year. The **2022 Village election** is expected to be held on **Tuesday, March 15, 2022** to select a slate of Trustees.

Who may run for elected public office in Scarsdale? While the CNC identifies potential candidates for open positions in the offices of Mayor and Trustees, and the Village Justice, Village residents may also apply for the CNC's consideration.

What is the time commitment of CNC members? The members of the CNC serve staggered three-year terms and meet over a period of only 5-6 evenings in November, December and January. Each of the three staggered classes of the CNC have 10 members, with two representing each of the village elementary school districts (Edgewood, Fox Meadow, Greenacres, Heathcote and Quaker Ridge). Members of the third-year graduating class then serve one year on the Procedure Committee, except for the two members of the graduating class elected by the CNC to serve as the next chair and vice chair of the CNC.

How do I become a member of the CNC? Two forms are required to apply to the CNC – a brief biography and a 10-signature petition signed by a candidate's neighbors. The **2021 CNC application forms** and instruction packet are attached AND posted on the PC's website. The **2021 CNC election**, in which voters choose their CNC representatives, will be held either by mail-in ballot or, if in-person voting is feasible, on **Tuesday, November 9** at Village Hall from 7:00AM to 9:00PM. If necessary, run-off elections will be held one week later.

When can I begin work on the CNC? The CNC begins its work in late fall with a public session for part of its first meeting at the end of November, followed by closed meetings for the rest of its schedule. Meetings are held on weekday evenings at Village Hall when feasible or electronically. The CNC's meetings, held in confidential executive sessions, are designed to encourage members of the public to run for village office on the nonpartisan slate without the pressures inherent in typical partisan politics. **CNC meeting dates for 2020-2021 are Monday, November 29, 2021 (Organization Meeting); Wednesday, December 8, 2021; Wednesday, December 15, 2021; Wednesday, January 5, 2022; Wednesday, January 12, 2022; and if necessary, Wednesday, January 19, 2022. All meetings begin at 8 PM.**

Why does Scarsdale have a nonpartisan election system? The system began in 1911 as a way to create a more civil process that would avoid the pitfalls of partisan politics, campaign financing and electioneering promises. The administration of the nonpartisan election system and the expenses of running the CNC election in November are publicly funded through contributions by residents. **Note:** Under New York State Law, qualified residents may run for village office against the CNC slate by obtaining the prescribed number of signatures on a nominating petition or by running a write-in campaign.

What is the Procedure Committee? The Procedure Committee administers the nonpartisan election system for village offices, guided by the Non-Partisan Resolution, a document that has been amended from time to time since the system was formalized in 1930. The Procedure Committee is tasked with recruiting candidates to run for the CNC, conducting the annual CNC elections in November, and proposing amendments to the Non-Partisan Resolution as needed.
